Last Week's Games

Warrington 21 Firwood Waterloo 10

In probably their best performance of the season, Warrington beat strong opposition to achieve a well-earned victory over Firwood Waterloo. This was a match where Warrington fired on all cylinders with immaculate line-out control, solid scrummaging against a heavier pack, aggressive scavenging at the breakdown and gritty defence all combining to provide a platform to free the side's talented attacking potential.

The opening quarter saw the teams engaged in a combative arm wrestle, which at times could have erupted into open warfare, had it not been for the masterly control of referee Robert Sheard. Eventually, Warrington broke the deadlock, when a Waterloo misdemeanor allowed Ben Hockenhull to slot a penalty goal.

Although by this time it was Warrington who were playing all the rugby, it was the visitors who scored next when their mobile hooker Scott Robson made a delicate break in the Warrington 22, which resulted in a good try in the corner.

However, Warrington continued to apply the pressure and when they were awarded a penalty after a Waterloo player was sin-binned, Ben Hockenhull took his side into a one point lead.

From the restart, full back Jamie Thompson showed great pace to take the ball well into Waterloo territory before combining with Tom Arnold but an excellent move came to an end with an unfortunate knock-on. The home side were now applying continuous pressure on the Waterloo line and it was almost inevitable that the visitors should have to react illegally, resulting in another sin-binning and a third penalty for Ben Hockenhull, which saw the sides turn round with Warrington 9-5 ahead.

The opening minutes of the second half saw Waterloo applying pressure on the Warrington line but the defence stood firm before Tom Wood cleared the line with a fifty yard clearance kick to touch. A Tom Wood kick almost provided Warrington's first try but the Waterloo defence managed to scramble the ball into touch just feet from the line.

However, the try was not long coming. After a scrappy period of play in mid-field, Kieron Hughes picked up a loose ball, jinked his way out of trouble and then handed onto Tom Arnold. From forty yards out, the speedy winger accelerated away from the cover, before sidestepping one tackler and swerving inside the full back to touch down under the posts. Ben Hockenhull made no mistake with the conversion.

With an eleven point cushion, Warrington continued in their attacking vein and were rewarded with a copy book try. Yet another superb line-out take from Sean Callendar saw Warrington go through two forward phases before releasing the ball to the backs, who showed slick hands to create space for left wing Nathan Beesley to show his exceptional pace and score his fortieth try in just 51 first team games.

By this time, Warrington were home and dry but Waterloo had the last word with a try in the final minute of an absorbing match.

"An excellent all-round performance," was the verdict of coach Andy Roberts. "I just hope we can maintain these standards and this passion when we meet Wilmslow, who are just one point ahead of us in the league table, on Saturday. It should be some game!"

Warrington 2nd XV 18 Liverpool University Veterinarians 14

Led by their inspirational captain, Craig Byrne, Warrington's second team won their third game in succession to beat a young and pacey Liverpool University Vets School and move to sixth place in the league. This after a dismal start to the season when they could manage only one win in five starts in September.

Warrington set out their strategy from the kick-off, using their experienced pack to minimize the threat of the visitors' pace. With their front row quickly gaining dominance in the set scrums and with Glenn Howson wreaking havoc in the loose, Warrington starved the opposition of exploitable possession and used the ball they created to good effect.

After twenty minutes this strategy bore fruit and a well-worked backs' move was finished off by the ubiquitous Mark Tickle who touched down under the posts. Darren Norman converted. A penalty from Darren Norman then increased the Warrington lead to ten points but the students struck back just before half time when continuous pressure eventually gave them the converted try they deserved.

Warrington increased their lead twenty minutes into the second period when Matt Rockey showed that he had lost none of his guile by ghosting through the defence before feeding Darren Norman and the full back drifted over in the corner.

Liverpool came back almost immediately to close the gap with a breakaway try but Darren Norman sealed the victory with a well-struck penalty from close to the touchline.

"Once again it was smart rugby that saw us through," explained coach Shaun McBriers. "We applied SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) thinking to maximize our strengths and minimize their threats. We now look forward to our testing visit to Fylde next week"
