Welcome to Broughton Park RUFC

Warrington RUFC extends a very warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators of Broughton Park RUFC today's visitors. We look forward to an enjoyable game and hospitality afterwards.

Today's sees the return fixture played back in December when Broughton Park ran out winners after a poor Warrington first 20 minutes which saw the match decided. In what has always been a tight league this season Broughton have had some impressive results and lie 6th in the North One West league table whilst Warrington 11th. Last time out Broughton Park overwhelmed Anselmians and Warrington lost in Douglas but came away with a try bonus point which could prove vital as the season draws to a close, 2 games remaining after today.

Our visitors **Broughton Park RUFC**, is one of the oldest rugby union clubs in England and was established in 1882, just one year after the Lancashire County Rugby Football Union was founded and eleven years after the formation of the national Rugby Football Union

Broughton Park was the third Broughton based rugby club, after Broughton RUFC (1862) and Broughton Rangers (1877). The club was overshadowed in terms of international

representation by its two neighbours for the first decade of its existence. In 1919, just after the First World War, it started to make a mark on the national scene with A M Crook becoming both the Lancashire Union president and also being elected to the presidency of the Rugby Football Union. J E Kidd was elected Lancashire president in 1930 and it was not until the 1960s that Broughton once again came to the fore. The glory days of the club were in the 1960s and 1970s and at one point they fielded four internationals on the pitch. In this period they also had two more Lancashire presidents and in 1981 in John Burgess they had a president of the Rugby Football Union. Broughton Park were never able to recapture the heights of this period, and in the professional era have not managed to reach the top flight. The club has had a number of different grounds in its time, mainly in the Salford/Prestwich areas, but also in the south of Manchester. Since 2004 its present new facility is at Hough End in Chorlton-cum-Hardy,

Perky's Paragraph continuing the story of WRUFC

THE STORY OF A NEW GROUND ---- BRIDGE LANE ---- Part 2

A special Ground Sub-Committee was appointed to go into the various work required. They held their first meeting in January 1960. Every aspect was discussed until a late hour, and the General Committee accepted the recommendations made. Plans were drawn up and submitted for approval to the Planning Authorities. Weeks elapsed and telephone wires became red hot from incessant chasing of the Authorities. Thursday April 28th saw yet another meeting with the various officials concerned. Then out of the blue it came 'If the Club agree to eight amendments to the submitted plans, then permission would be given.' The President and the Secretary were aghast. By how much would the amendments increase the cost of the scheme? The additional costs were carefully investigated and found reasonable and so the General Committee accepted the various amendments to the plans on the 11th May, 1960, and the road ahead was clear. Marvellous all the summer months for work to forge ahead.

Mr. William Hankey had kindly harrowed and seeded the pitches. The grass grew well with an exceptionally good take. Messrs. Gartons had fulfilled their promise that the seed would germinate well. During this period the fencing was erected and completely enclosed the ground. June saw the foundations for the pavilion being laid and then Halt!! Weeks turned into months and progress became 'snail like'. The Secretary's blood pressure was never so high. Then, as if by a miracle, action recommenced. In August the drains were laid and the building shot up. By September the work was far enough ahead for the joiners and electricians to move in and do their work.

'Open Bonfire night' was the aim. Six weeks left, could it be done? The lining, insulation, wiring and partitioning were finished, near to the end of October. Alan Peaker was plumbing and glazing, whilst vociferously enlightening his young apprentice about the finer points of the trade. Ten days to go, the workmen from Messrs. Val de Travers arrived, and the Rock asphalt floor was laid in a day and a half. Then came one of the biggest lifts the Club had received when Norman Cumings met Bill Baines and Alan James in the Clubhouse one night and offered to help with the decoration and painting. True to his word the job was well and truly done. Sunday October 30th saw a very large work party mustered.

Bonfire wood was brought from all the district and all day long Bernard Bretherton and his helpers fetched and carried. Bob Young, ably assisted by a horde of youngsters, stacked and re-stacked the Bonfire. Others laid the drive and finished off other work. Suddenly panic stations. It was realised that 'the Bar', the hub of the Club's facilities, was still to be installed. Fingers were crossed but as promised, Greenall Whitley & Co. Limited came along and fitted the Bar counter, display shelves etc. Right through Saturday morning work went on until the band of helpers could do no more so at 12-45 p.m. on Bonfire day, those who were due to play at Bury in the afternoon dashed off for a quick snack, change and hectic collecting of their kit. Triumph all along the line for the 1st team won 12-11 and then a rush back to the ground. Spectators came in their hundreds to see the gigantic Bonfire and Firework display. Now to relax over a quiet drink in our new home. Some hopes. A struggle through ten rows of friends and visitors to the Bar. Sorry, no glasses left. A hectic chase round and you grabbed the first empty glass and pushed through to the front again, served, you were glad to reach the comparative peace and quiet of the dressing rooms to enjoy the fruits of your efforts.

An extension licence enabled the cash to pour into the till giving the Club a record breaking first night's business. At 12-30 a.m. the workers gathered in the Clubhouse to survey the chaotic conditions in the Clubroom which rather resembled the debris left behind after flood waters had subsided. Too late to start on the cleaning work we thought so leave it until the morning. Someone thought the fire was a bit on the big side to leave unattended. Stockton Heath Fire Brigade were telephoned, quickly arrived and agreed that if the wind had changed direction the fire might have been dangerous. 400 gallons of water were pumped on to the fire but nevertheless on Tuesday following the big night children from the neighbourhood were still sitting round the smouldering embers. No time for relaxation yet. There was still plenty of work to be done. Work parties were organised at night time and at week ends with the help of Mr. Michael Stansfield they have carried on throughout the summer months with the results that you see tonight. What's that you say? It sounds like three years of hectic endeavour. You are right it certainly was both on the administrative and physical side but now at least those who have helped in any way can say that the labour has not been in vain.

Last weeks match at Douglas saw our illustrious head coach stumble onto the pitch to notch up his 100th first team game, some mighty say that he tried valiantly to avoid this milestone, himself included, but non the less the fool stepped onto the field in Douglas and gained this accolade.

Andy came to the club 8 years ago as a player coach, during the Steve Riley era and had an instant impact, making his debut against Hoylake where we won 13-10, there won't be many that would argue with his attaching flair, as on the front foot his range of passing is up there w it's some of the best we've seen at the wire, defensively, 10's don't tackle!! His mantra and one he ferocious stuck to.

Through out his regular playing Andy crossed the white wash 22 times, 1 this season, and kicked 8 conversions, 5 penalties and a filthy drop goal. He has transferred into coaching very well and has been instrumental in keeping us up where we belong.

Along the way Andy says he has played with some brilliant players namely, Kieran Hughes, Jake Ashall & any back rows that make his tackles for him! While winning the league in 2013, over today's opposition, was one of his favourites the victory away at New Brighton in the previous season, 36-5, one of the 8 on the bounce to pull off the great escape holds a special place.

Warrington 2nd XV 37-29 Broughton Park 2nd XV

In an exciting and entertaining game, which saw Broughton Park almost achieve a Lazarus comeback, Warrngton managed to tough it out and even denied the vistors a losing bonus point with the last kick of the match.

Warrington started well but it was Park who scored first when their veteran centre, who was dangerous every time he touched the ball, used his strength to force his way over. Warrington could easily have scored when an exquisite back pass, out of the back door from Shaun McDermott to Craig Byrnes should have borne fruit but the last pass went astray. However, Warrington got on the scorebard minutes later when Park knocked on in their five yard zone and the ball was picked up and flashed out to Max Caldwell and the elusive winger scored in the corner. Ben Dixon converted.

Ben Dixon then increased Warrington's lead when he kicked a penalty after a signature bullocking run from Craig Byrnes to make the half time score 10-5.

Ten minutes into the second period a second Dixon penalty increased Warrington's lead. This was soon increased when Warrington pressed on the visitors' line and a brilliant tap-on pass found Alex Stewart who screeched through a gap in the defence to touch down under the posts. Ben Dixon added the extras. Warrington's lead was soon increased to 22 points when Jack stride field a long-distance Park clearance kick and made good ground. The Warrington forwards piled into the ensuing ruck and a deft short pass from Ben Dixon was picked up by Craig Byrnes, who showed that he is unstoppable from five yards, to smash over. Ben Dixon again converted.

Broughton Park replied with a second try from their veteran centre but from the restart Warrington applied pressure up front and eventually Andy Buck picked up and weaved his way over for an excellent try. Ben Dixon again converted and Warrington looked unassailable at 34-10 with ten minutes to go.

Unfortunately, Broughton Park had not read the script. They first cut the lead with a third try from their centre and then were awarded a penalty try With the game in its dying minutes, they scored another converted try to bring them within five points of Warrington. But when Warrington were awarded a penalty with the clock already in the red, up stepped Ben Dixon to kick a goal from half way and deny Park the consolation of a losing bonus point.

"What a game," was the summing up of skipper Craig Byrnes. "The result keeps us at third in the league with just one game left against league leaders Birkenhead Park."

Douglas (IOM) 1st XV 41 - 26 Warrington 1st XV

Warrington did well to leave the Isle of Man with a four-try bonus point but still languish at 11th in North 1 West just a single point above Burnage. With just three more games to play, the bonus point could prove important.

After an opening ten minutes where both sides tested each others' defences, Warrington were the first on the scoreboard when Nathan Beasley once again showed his exceptional speed to run in from half way and touch down under the posts. Darren Norman converted. Douglas soon replied when the referee allowed them to take a quick tap penalty, having refused Warrington a similar opportunity minutes earlier, and their winger scored in the corner.

Douglas then increased their lead when the forwards combined well and set up a good driving try, which was converted, while a penalty just before half time saw them 15-7 ahead at the turn-around.

It didn't take long for Warrington to reduce the lead. Darren Norman, who was excellent throughout, made a telling break before handing onto Steve Pilkington and the centre finished off with style. Darren Norman's conversion saw Warrington just one point in arrears. This was to be short-lived as Douglas soon increased their lead when the flashed the ball across the field from a set scrum and their right winger again touched down n the corner for a try which was converted. Not content with their new 8 point lead, Douglas scored again almost immediately to secure their four-try bonus point. Warrington came back when Tom Green crashed over, after patient attacking from his pack and the conversion reduced Douglas's lead to just six points.

Unfortunately, sloppy play allowed the home side to cross for two more converted tries although Warrington had the last word when that man Beasley touched down for his second try to secure the bonus point.

"We knew this was going to be a tough game," admitted coach Andy Roberts, "But perhaps the final score was a little flattering to Douglas. I was pleased with the way the lads stepped up today and hopefully we can take the same attitude into our remaining three fixtures


