1st XV Season Review

First of all I must point out that I'm absolutely delighted that we will retain our position in North West One next season which given the quality of the league this year and the fact that potentially 65 points could take you down, you will understand how proud I am to know that once again we'll ply our trade in an extremely competitive NW 1 competition next season.

Whilst the last couple of months have seen us battling with at least 8 other clubs to keep away from the 3rd relegation slot, it must be noted that dependant on Saturday's result we could finish as high as 6th which would be yet another fantastic achievement given the quality of the league and the semi-professional approach that many clubs now have. Whilst we will never go down that route it must be noted how well the squad perform year in year out despite the difficulties we face as running as a true amateur club.

Looking back through our results this week, it is increasingly evident that we have lacked consistency in our performances but when I looked deeper and realised that 5 of our losses were within 7 points (3 within two points), it would not have been inconceivable of us to be battling it out towards the top of the table. This is where we want to be and I'll certainly be reviewing the areas in which we need to improve before embarking on next year.

Standout moments from the year have to include doing the double over Northwich and Stockport and an impressive win away at Birkenhead in the opening game of the season. We have played in the way I expect the game to be played which is fast paced and entertaining to watch. Yes, this is sometimes possibly our downfall but my philosophy is very much centred around attacking, entertaining rugby which is pleasing to watch; something I'm sure our spectators will agree with.

It would be wrong of me to single individual players out as I very much believe in a squad effort but I must congratulate Chris White on playing in all 26 league games this season. A phenomenal effort and even more so given his front row position.

I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate Craig Byrne and Shaun Mcdermott on leading the 2nd team to their highest ever league finish. A fantastic achievement especially when you consider the strength of some of the 2nd teams in that league.

I would also like to thank all those associated with Rugby at Warrington RUFC from the Groundsman, House Managers, Bar and Catering Staff, Paul (Scoreboard Operator), Sponsors and of course our very trusted and loyal supporters who follow us everywhere. Your roles are hugely appreciated by all the Senior Players and Coaches.

Anselmians 1st XV 14 - 40 Warrington 1st XV

A stop-go performance, featuring six excellent tries, ensured Warrington's place in next season's North 1 West. This was guaranteed later when news came of the defeats of both Manchester and Firwood Waterloo, which means that the game between these two giants of yesteryear next week will determine who joins Anselmians and De La Salle in the lower division in September.

Warrington began this game rather nervously and the first of many mistakes came within two minutes when they knocked on in their own 22. However, they made immediate amends for this by driving the opposition pack off their own ball and quickly set up am attack. Strangely, they were penalised at a second scrum but the Anselmians' kick was wide. The first Warrington score seemed to have come when Steve Pilkington made a telling break and kicked ahead. The ever-dangerous Nathan Beesley followed up and touched down but the linesman belatedly signalled that the winger had stepped in touch and the try was disallowed.

Ten minutes later, Tom Wood was held up over the line and when Warrington knocked on from the subsequent scrum, the chance had vanished. But, inevitably the opening try came when Tom Arnold broke out of his own 22, shrugged off two tackles and handed onto Dan Fleming, who showed hitherto-hidden pace to race over from 40 yards.

Shortly after, the backs combined well and Kieran Hughes made the half break before passing to Steve Pilkington, who finished clinically from 30 yards. Nathan Beesley showed his versatility by stepping up to convert the try. Warrington, enjoying a plethora of possession, then started to attack through their forwards. They were unlucky not to score after a forward drive but the referee claimed he was unsighted and gave an attacking scrum. Warrington used the scrummage platform well and prolonged driving eventually saw ubiquitous hooker Chris White claim the touch down. Beesley again converted from close to the touchline and the sides turned around with Warrington 19-0 ahead.

The scoreboard was soon ticking over again when Warrington won quick ball and Kieran Hughes slipped a pass to Nathan Beesley, who flipped a superb back-of-hand pass to Chris White who crossed for his second score of the match, to gain Warrington the four-try bonus point. Once again, Beesley converted from the touchline.

It wasn't long before a further seven points was added to Warrington's total. Kieran Hughes received the ball from a scrum on the half-way line and the little magician showed that he has lost none of his exceptional talent by dancing through the defence and sprinting the final thirty yards to touch down under the posts. Beesley made no mistake with the conversion.

Anselmians then had their ten minutes of glory, first when they scored a beautifully worked try between the sticks and then when they were awarded a penalty try. But it was Warrington who had the last word and, fittingly, it was scored by the talismanic Tom Wood, who demonstrated his signature show-and-go to ghost over for a try, which was again converted by Nathan Beesley.

"This was probably not our best performance of the season," admitted coach Andy Roberts. "We made too many mistakes and perhaps a few of the players were a little to anxious to get on the score-sheet. Still, it was a five-pointer, which combined with other results today, guarantees our place in this league next season. Next week, we play third-placed Birkenhead Park in a match, which kicks off at 1.30. Birkenhead Park also play our second team in a 3.30 kick-off. It should be a great afternoon's rugby!"


